



renewing memberships, we continue to maintain relative historic levels compared to years past. As you can see from the graphics, our growth potential still remains at converting Students to Associate levels after graduation ... which happens to be about now. Coincidence? No such thing.

Students ... listen up! Here's some important information just for you!



The job market, though starting to open up, is still difficult for many graduates to break into the interior design profession. There are many opportunities and options for graduates to upgrade to the Associate Level or even remain at Student Level. Let's break it down:

- Option 1 upgrade now to Associate Level and pay a prorated/discounted rate for the balance of the year.
- Option 2 still finding difficulty getting the job, opt to continue at the Student Level for one more year. Do this at the renewal period which start in July and runs through August. (You must have joined by Dec. 2010 for this option.)
- Option 3 Best Deal Ever at renewal time (July through August) request a Bridge Membership to upgrade to the Associate Level for around half the cost of regular Associate Dues for the balance of 2011 and all of 2012. (You must have joined by Dec. 2010 for this option.)

Membership matters. Not only does it support the profession, but it provides you the tools to meet other interior designers, mingle with our Industry Partners (who knows who's hiring and who's not), post your resume, and check the job listings.



On March 8th, Rep. Bill Callegari, who is an engineer by degree and profession, filed HB 2142 to abolish the regulation of the practice of interior design. And then on March 10th, Rep. Callegari filed HB 3167 which was another bill to abolish us and HB 3166 which also abolished us along with consolidation of

agencies. Many have asked why this gentleman was trying to abolish us and we really don't have an answer that we can say is the truth. We believe that we got caught in an ongoing battle between the engineers and the architects and eliminating the interior designers would make the TBAE ripe for takeover by the engineering board. I sent out emails requesting your help and you were great. Many committee members received numerous professional letters and trust me it made a difference. HB 2142 has never had a committee hearing.

Many, many thanks to Louise Nicholson Carter, John DuBard and Kimberly Marks for giving their day and providing excellent testimony. We began our testimony with three other gentlemen, Chase Bearden with the Coalition for Texans with Disabilities, John Torkelson with Access Partnership and Kurt Harris, with the State Fire Marshal's office.

HB 3167 was sent to the Government Efficiency and Reform committee which Rep. Callegari chairs so we did have a committee hearing on April 7th. This bill was not heard until 10:30 pm after a very long day of waiting. Many, many thanks to Louise Nicholson Carter, John DuBard and Kimberly Marks for giving their day and providing excellent testimony. We began our testimony with three other gentlemen, Chase Bearden with the Coalition for Texans with Disabilities, John Torkelson with Access Partnership and Kurt Harris, with the State Fire Marshal's office. The hearing began with the chairman laying out the bill (standard protocol) and it was obvious from some of the things that he said that he had

been given some partial facts from the Institute for Justice. I was able to testify last and it gave me the perfect opportunity to correct all the misinformation and to 'give the rest of the story' (thanks Paul Harvey) which meant correcting misinformation and adding facts that the committee members asked. On April 19th, I returned to Austin to answer more questions and at the end of our two hour meeting I think we gave enough information to stop the bills from progressing. HB 3167 is moving forward and is now in the Senate but it no longer has one word about interior designers. We are no longer mentioned in the title and thereby we can not be added back in

as we are no longer 'germane' to the new version of HB 3167. On April 21st, HB 3166 was heard and the committee substitute included interior designers – so good news for us. HB 3166, is the bill to consolidate the Texas Board of Architectural Examiners with the Texas Board of Professional Engineers into one agency called the Texas Board of Professional Services along with land surveyors. This bill also added \$200.00 to each professional's annual renewal fees. This bill ended in the Calendars committee. On May 17th, this bill was folded into an amendment to be attached to SB 1811 which was the budget bill. For days we worked quietly behind the scenes asking our representatives to oppose amendment #824244. Enough representatives agreed with us and persuaded Rep. Callegari to withdraw the amendment. This bill is now in Senate and House conference committee.

HB 2284 by Rep. Rick Hardcastle is a bill relating to the practice of architecture and engineering. This bill has passed the Senate and now awaits concurrence in the House. We believe it is likely to be on the Governor's desk before the session ends. This is an agreed upon bill between the architects and the engineers to put an end to their long battle, some refer to it as the "Peace" bill.

Utilizing Local Resources for a Positive Impact


As an associate of American Art Resources, I have had the privilege of working on unique projects from around the United States with clients who have specific wants, needs, and visions. One of these clients

is in our own backyard: Texas Children's Hospital. Texas Children's Hospital is known for its recognizable branding, which involves patient-produced artwork using specialized colors. During the hospital's recent expansion called "Vision 2010," American Art Resources

We involved local students and teachers from fifty-two schools and four school districts, current Texas Children's Hospital patients, and metro-area professional artists, vendors, and organizations.

was asked to help lead the artwork acquisition. One of the projects included in Vision 2010 is Texas Children's West Campus, located at I-10 and Barker Cypress. This newly constructed hospital has a mission to become a leading community-based facility for residents living in and around the Katy area. In wanting to keep the brand of Texas Children's Hospital cohesive with their Medical Center facilities, the art program smartly looked to the Katy community for help.

Along with the exceptional team at Texas Children's, American Art Resources spearheaded a multi-regional artwork search to obtain one-of-a-kind pieces. We involved local students and teachers from fifty-two schools and four school districts, current Texas Children's Hospital patients, and metro-area professional artists, vendors, and organizations. To maintain the structure's architectural theme of bringing outdoor elements



inside, special features within the space include- eight monumental exterior metal tree sculptures; a beautiful pendant butterfly installation adjacent to the chapel; a breathtaking two-story window-applied graphic; remarkable blown-glass plants for aquariums; and a fantasy "Dream" corridor consisting of a multi-medium collage installed on expansive curving walls, all of which co-exist with more than six hundred child-produced two-dimensional pieces.

The two-story window-applied graphic is the result of a collaboration of local resources solving an architectural dilemma. The architectural team needed a window film to let natural light into the building without overheating the volunteers in the space. Our team was approached by ARTreach, a Katy-area non-profit that provides art educational support to communities, with a generous offer to help. When we told them about the need for

a window film graphic, ARTreach asked local awardwinning artist Vickie McMillan to work with several students in their after school program. She and the students, keeping the interior finishes in mind, used watercolor to paint a beautiful scene of what one might see in the Katy landscape. A local vendor then scanned the piece to transform it into a vast graphic to be applied to the window. Because the film is not noticeable from the outside, the integrity of the exterior is not compromised, and the space is now embellished with this awe-inspiring installation that allows the volunteers to be comfortable in their setting.

Day two of the event began with a panel breakfast discussion. The panelists comprised of five designers from varying backgrounds and ranging in age. A moderator facilitated the discussion, having students ask well thought-out questions to the group during a plated breakfast.

As the panel breakfast wrapped up, students were whisked away to small group presentations and portfolio review sessions. Students without portfolios attended three 101 topics, each 30 minutes long, all touching on the theme of post-graduation expectations and exploring the question of what to do after graduation. Students who brought a completed portfolio were able to choose two 101 topics to attend, and additionally participate in a one-on-one portfolio review session with a design professional!

Lauren Von Drehle and Kristy Emmrich, the event co-chairs, were dedicated to making this year's conference a successful and distinguished event with their desire to see the TX OK Student Conference continue to grow and flourish.

The event closed with a keynote speaker luncheon and awards ceremony. Tom Vechionne, Design Director and Principal at Gensler - New York, provided an inspirational speech on "How Design Calls for Leadership". The presentation explored four ideas for the pursuit of happiness in design: living the art of possibility, driving change, embracing successful failures, and getting personal.
